# Exhibition of Herzog pastels

Heidi Herzog, a master of the pastel and a name not, unfortunately, heard much on the exhibition circuit, is to hold one of her rare shows in Johannesburg next week. It opens in Gallery 101 on Monday.

She will be showing about 30 pastels and oils. The exhibition is to be opened by Professor G. E. Kerrich.

Heidi Herzog's impressionistic flower studies and landscapes, filled with a dream-like lyricism and executed with a masterly technique, are much sought after by discriminating collectors. Although she is not an artist whose name is constantly in the headlines, her works will be found in private collections in many parts of the world.

She has been invited to exhibit on the Continent and in New York next year.

Heidi Herzog is descended from a long-established Swiss family. She was trained in Europe under some very distinguished masters, including Derain and Dunnoyer de Segonzac; she also worked at the Munich Academy.

Mrs. Heidi Herzog, a well-known Johannesburg flower and landscape artist, died at the weekend after an open-heart operation.

Mrs. Herzog was born on December 7, 1905, at Basle, Switzerland. She settled in South Africa 16 years ago, after travelling throughout the world.

She was trained in Europe under such masters as Derain and Dunnoyer de Segonzac, and also worked at the Munich Academy.

Her paintings, done over 37 years, are to be found in many of the world's biggest collections.
