INTRODUCTION

Norman Catherine is as dertigjarige sekter die jongste kunstenaar in Suid-Afrika wat met 'n oorsigtentoontelling by 'n Universiteitsgalerij verser word.

In samewerking met die Randse Afrikaanse Universiteit kan ek met trots 'n seleksie van meer as 100 werke van Norman Catherine aanbied, wat uit private en publieke versamelinge in die Johannesburgsgebied geleen is, en wat die afgelope 10 jaar verteenwoordig.

Norman Catherine, Suid-Afrika se mees talentvolle en omstrede kunstenaar, wat tot nadenke stimuleer, politieke en sosiale commentator, meester van die sputkunst-tegniek, wat in hierdie land deur slegs 'n paar privaatverzamelaars waardere word, en tog gesog is onder overseas kenners, sal vroeg in 1980 vertrek na Los Angeles, Kalifornië, waar hy vertrug om 2 tot 3 jaar deur te bring.

Met sy vertrek hoop ek dat Suid-Afrika nie 'n baie goede kunstenaar verloor nie, en dat hy in die toekoms van sy nuwe Amerikaanse werk in Suid-Afrika sal uitstaal.
