

Borbereki, one of the best known South African sculptors, was born in Hungary. Studied at the Academy of Budapest and later in Rome. From 1931 to 1933, he was Professor of Fine Arts at the Academy in Budapest.

Borbereki exhibited five times at the Venice

Won the Grand Prix at an International Exhibition in Paris in 1937.

Borbereki's work has been acquired by several European Museums; also by the Durban Art Gallery. He has exhibited in many countries overseas and has had over twenty exhibitions in South Africa.

His last and most successful exhibition was held at Gallery 101 in 1961.

## PROF. JACK HEATH

WINNER OF THE PAINTING SECTION

Was trained in England, came to South Africa after the last war. Was Head of the School of Art in Port Elizabeth for some years, presently Head of the School of Art of the University of Natal, Pietermaritzburg. He paints very large panels, and works on the "golden mean" principle, analysing the shapes of subjects in painting.



### THE GALLERY 101 - U.A.T. 1962 SCHOLARSHIP

This is the first annual art competition we are holding on a nation-wide basis, thanks to the close collaboration with U.A.T. French Airlines, on whose jetliners the overall first prize winners will travel to Europe to take up a Scholarship to further their studies.

We believe that it is more stimulating for the artist to solve a definite problem, and we have therefore decided to give a general theme annually. This year's theme was a fairly wide subject, but unfortunately the problem was in the main only lightly touched. Entries from all over South Africa and South West Africa were received in the following sections: Painting; Sculptures; Graphic Work and Drawings; Stained Glass: Batik: and so on.

We are very grateful to Mr. A. M. van Schoor for consenting to open the exhibition; also to the Judging Panel, which included Prof. M. Bokhorst, Cape Town; The Hon. Justice J. F. Marais, Pretoria; Prof. Dr. H. M. van der Westhuysen, Pretoria; Mr. Serge Combard, Johannesburg; and Mr. Monty Sack, Johannesburg.

In spite of all our efforts, we have been unsuccessful in convincing leading South African industrialists to sponsor an art competition, although large sums are made available annually for non-educational purposes. It is a great pity if one considers the tremendous support art receives in Europe and the U.S.A. We are happy to sponsor the various winners in this competition. So much artistic potentialities exist in our country that we hope to be able to do better next year.

The lack of entries by Non-White artists was due to misguided suggestions made by certain art circles. We do not want to give the impression that restrictions were made by us. The Scholarship was open to all.

### The Gallery 101 - U.A.T. 1963 Scholarship

The theme for the competition to be held in February/March, 1963, will be "ARBEID — WORK."
We look forward with interest to our artists' efforts. Further details will be announced in due course.

We are grateful to the support given by our many artist friends and patrons to Mrs. Fernande Haengqi, who runs the Gallery.


Outstanding exhibitions held in the past were, e.g.:
