BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES: Heidi Herzog began painting at Torre del Greco (Italy) in 1931. She worked throughout Italy and France, was influenced by André Derain and Dunoyer de Segonzac. Held first joint exhibition at the Galeries Modernes, Marseilles. Worked later at La Cadière d'Azur with Lemerrier and André Favory. Held one-man exhibition at Musee d'Arles. Decisive period at Aix-en-Provence.

Came to South Africa after the war.
